The Rev. Dr. Chun-Ming Kao was General Secretary of the Presbyterian Church in Taiwan. In the 1980s he was one of the leaders of a protest gathering in Taiwan celebrating Human Rights. The gathering was a call for democracy in Taiwan. He was arrested and sentenced to 7 years in prison. He served 4 years of that sentence. While he was in prison he composed the above poem.

We are in Eastertide – the season of Transformation. Before transformation can happen, sacrifice, taking risk and even death must come first. We all love the idea of transformation – a vision of a better alternative of the present. But not very many are willing to pay the price.

Easter happened through suffering (Passion), death (Calvary) and entombment (Holy Saturday). As they say, “no pain, no gain,” “No thorn, no crown.” Jesus is the man who was willing to pay the costly price of transformation so the better order becomes possible. He was willing to die on the cross so the world may live. He was willing to pay the price of sin and evil and death to give us salvation. Through Christ’s life, death, and resurrection we are reconciled us to God, to one another and the rest of God’s creation, and to our better self. Christ paid the costly price of sin and death.

Our mission as United Methodists is to make and mature disciples for the transformation of the world. Making disciples is our sole mission. The fruit of doing our mission is the transformation of lives and situations. To be faithful to our mission means –

- We must be willing to carry our cross and carry it every day as we follow Christ (Matthew 16);
- Be willing to receive pruning so we become fruitful (John 15)

- Be willing to fall and buried to the ground like grains so we will rise up again with more shoots and in due time we will bring forth more flowers and fruits for the harvest (John 12)
- Be willing to serve rather than to be served, to be the last, to give our lives as ransom for many (Mark 10)
- To preach good news to the poor, giving sights to the blind, healing to the sick, and freedom to the captives and oppressed (Luke 4)
- To welcome every one especially the children, the lost, the last and the least (Matthew 18, 25; Galatians 3:28).
- Preaching and practicing full salvation for all people and creation (Matthew 4:23-25; Romans 8:18-25).

The renowned preacher Philips Brooks said, "O, do not pray for easy lives. Pray to be stronger men [women, youth and children]! Do not pray for tasks equal to your powers. Pray for powers equal to your tasks! Then the doing of your work shall be no miracle. But you shall be a miracle. Every day you shall wonder at yourself, at the richness of life which has come to you by the grace of God."

May we be faithful agents of transformation by loving God with all we have and are, loving our neighbors as we love ourselves, and caring for mother earth as our home. So be it.
